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What is the International Youth Conference?

The origin

After 2016 and 2018, the International Youth Conference 2022 was the third youth conference in Regensburg. The City of Regensburg organized the first youth conference in the summer of 2016. This conference was a great success. Hence, the city decided to hold an International Youth Conference regularly. In consequence, the project management of 2022 could rely on experience, which facilitated the planning.

Idea and aim

The idea of We R international is to bring young people from our twin cities together, regardless of the income of their families. Why are we interested in doing this? Because young people are our future and this future cannot function without thinking outside the box! There is no everyday life without global networks and cooperation. The International Youth Conference wants to create a lasting effect on understanding, exchange and tolerance across national borders. As we face increasing political instabilities and extremist trends it is

important to support young people's commitment and open-mindedness all over the world.

Moreover, on an individual level, each single young person should get a chance to make international experiences in order to gain insights in different cultures, practice foreign languages, reflect his or her points of view, get more self-confident, etc. This should not be the privilege of those growing up in well-off homes. That is why the City of Regensburg does not ask for any financial contribution from the participants and their families.

This year's conference concentrated on environmental issues and participation. The motto "One world. Our chance. Time to act." invited the participants to treat challenging, current topics like "nutrition", "biodiversity" or "human rights". It provided a framework for controversial discussions and encouraged young people's participation.

We R international - Financing

The 3rd International Youth Conference cost about 38.000 €. The "Forum Internationaler Jugendaustausch Regensburg (FIJR)" supported the event financially with 25.000 €.







Program for the guest chaperons

While the participants of the conference worked in their workshops, the chaperons took part in an accompanying program.

On Wednesday afternoon, they explored Regensburg from the water. The group took a boat trip, the so called "Strudelfahrt", along the river Danube. The focus was on the history of Regensburg as well as on learning interesting facts and sights about the city. Thursday morning had a culinary start. The chaperones went on a guided tour of the Kneitinger brewery. In addition to getting exciting insights into the art of brewing, they had the opportunity to taste regional beer.

Finally, they did a guided tour of the "Prinz-Leopold-Kaserne" on Friday morning. Many new residential buildings are currently being planned on the former barracks site in the east of Regensburg. Since the planning process takes time, in the meantime, the area is being used artistically by the association "Kulturviertel Regensburg e.V." Here the chaperones got some insight into this sociocultural interim use.

Welcome Evening Sunday, 31st of July 2022

On Sunday, the focus was on the arrival of the groups. After the room distribution, everybody got their conference materials and group photos were taken. Furthermore, the young people chose the workshops they wanted to attend. They made a priority list from the offered workshops Biodiversity, Clothing, Consumption & Trading, Human Rights and Nutrition. The lists were analysed overnight and the next day it was announced in which workshop the participants were. Afterwards, the evening started with getting-to-know games. During the dinner in a relaxed atmosphere, everyone got to know each other better and prepared for the day ahead.

Let the conference begin! Monday, 1st of August 2022

Mayor Mrs. Maltz-Schwarzfischer opened the conference officially. This was followed by presentations of the young people about their hometowns. Besides great pictures, funny and creative presentations, there was also a very moving presentation from Odessa.

After a common lunch in the cafeteria, Maxi Ernest from the NGO Welthungerhilfe gave a keynote speech on the topic of climate, sustainability and the Sustainable Development Goal "zero hunger". Afterwards a so-called "World Café" was set up. This method created a good atmosphere to exchange views on the various workshop topics. The workshop leaders took the results of the World Café as connecting element into their workshops.

A World Café is a participatory method in which one question is being discussed at each table. The participants rotate from table to table, with one person remaining at the table and reporting to the next group about the previous discussion. The group continues the discussion.

The evening programme took place at the Utopia youth centre in Burgweinting. There was a delicious barbecue in a cosy atmosphere with a DJ. Afterwards, the participants were able to do various sports activities.





Time of the workshops

Tuesday, 2nd of August 2022

The second day of the conference started with a group photo at the multi-generation house. After some funny photos with a drone, the group participated in an intercultural exercise. This exercise made development- promoting and development- inhibiting factors visible. It became clear how essential appreciation and empathy are for intercultural cooperation.

Afterwards, the participants explored the city of Regensburg and spent the rest of the morning on guided city tours. As the young people from Regensburg already knew their city, they visited the new "Energie-Bildungszentrum um:welt" where they participated in an exciting Escape Game about environment.

Finally, in the afternoon, it was time for the workshops. After getting to know each other, the participants started working on the content right away.


The evening program, including dinner, took place at the families of the youngsters from Regensburg. They had invited the other young people from the twin cities to their homes to give an insight into their families and spent a great evening together.

Wednesday, 3rd of August 2022 & Thursday, 4th of August 2022

The following days, all the participants worked diligently in their workshops. Depending on the topics, they cooked, rapped, interviewed people or even sprayed artwork.

However, there was also a common entertaining evening program: On Wednesday, they were invited to an intercultural bowling event and on Thursday they enjoyed a concert at "W1- Zentrum für junge Kultur". Moreover, they were given the opportunity to visit the exhibition "Zwischentöne" by the artist Heike Czerner. The exhibition showed the results of a project by High School students who gave expressions to thoughts and feelings about the Corona pandemic. And of course, everybody tasted typical local food, when they visited a typical Bavarian beer garden on Thursday.

On the evening of the concert, a VIP delegation from Brixen, who did not want to miss the final evening the next day, joined the group.





Workshop Biodiversity

Workshop management: David Buchner & Manuel Grüll (volunteer)

The workshop on biodiversity dealt with the reality of man-made species extinction. Besides discussing the topic, the students had the chance to express their opinions on the topic by spray-painting political messages.

On the first day of the workshop, the participants met in the conference room of the cultural center W1. In the beginning, the internationally mixed group had the opportunity to learn interesting things from each other through various group games, e.g. through artistic methods such as painting upside-down portraits of each other. With the cheerful energy of these first activities, the participants were given a preview over the workshop agenda and invited to write down their wishes and expectations.

On Wednesday, the young people dealt more intensively with the topic of species extinction and biodiversity. They watched a short documentary film on the subject and discussed its content afterwards. In addition, all students researched an endangered species that is native to their places of residence, created a short profile with interesting facts and then presented them to each other. After the well-deserved lunch break, the group dealt with graffiti as a form of political activism. In addition to that, the youngsters painted some "Hello my name is" stickers with short political messages addressing the problem of the extinction crisis. Afterwards, first by themselves, then in pairs and finally together, they looked for possible ideas in the broad field of "biodiversity" that the group would like to deal with artistically. The result were four solid ideas in the form of sketches.

The third day of the workshop started with a short lecture on the Agenda 2030 and the political implementation of the content of the 15th goal, which deals with the conservation of biodiversity.

Then, the group democratically chose their two final ideas. After that, it was time to work out the sketches in more detail. Before lunch, the required colors were bought in the local skate shop so that everything was ready for implementation. In the afternoon, the group went to a legal graffiti wall called "24 Hours Gallery". After a brief practical instruction from the workshop leader on how to handle the spray cans, they started painting.

On Friday, the last day of the workshop, the two groups finished their paintings, worked on details and added their signatures. After taking photos of the results, they went back to the W1 to prepare the presentation of the workshop. In the evening, the young group proudly presented their results at the closing event.

Workshop Clothing

Workshop management: Lucia Gruber & Anna Flecknová (student trainee)

This workshop was about the clothing industry. The main aim was to gain insight into a sector, which has an impact on our social, natural and cultural environment and to understand how individuals could act sustainable. The workshop had five parts: exchange of existing knowledge, input, discussion, city tour and activities (upcycling and shopping guides).

At the beginning, the participants talked about the clothing industry and how clothing is handled in the countries they came from. Soon it became clear that the topic has a negative connotation, which is noticeable in key terms like "fast fashion", "child labour", "living conditions", "low-paid" and "collapsed factory building". The group came to the conclusion that "fast fashion" causes many of the above mentioned issues. For example, cheap production implies unemployed worker and children as low-cost workers, ... The young participants of the workshop were concerned about these conditions. They experienced personal conflicts as, on the one hand, they wish to dress fashionable with the little money they have in order to belong to their peer group and not be bullied or outcast. On the other hand, they want to consume in an ethically correct manner. Therefore, they agreed, that each individual has a right to their own well-being. The group had voiced the following consent: "Basic needs, must be met for every human being in the world." The group discussed, how it is possible to reconcile those aspects, while acting sustainable. They concluded that each person for themselves as well as the society must change their consumer behavior. This includes consuming less clothing, buying second hand and fair trade, repairing and upcycling existing cloths.

Afterwards, the group went on a city tour through Ratisbona to get to know shops implementing the mentioned criteria: the second-hand-shops "Peacehand" and "Oxfam", as well as the "world-store una terra". A "world-store" sells fair-trade products from developing countries to support poor people in these countries. The participants of the workshop prepared an interview to learn more about the philosophy of the stores and the individual mindset of the people working there. On the way to the third store, we found a cabinet filled with well-preserved everyday articles to take and to exchange for free (Verschenkeschrank).

In the following discussions, the participants came to the conclusion that everyone – especially also politicians – should demand the following requirements:

- Produce more organic products!
- Spread the companies in different countries, not only in the poor ones!
- Confront the factory managers with the facts about the conditions of the workers!
- Proper wage! Minimum wage!
- Equal human stand in society, independent of the income
- Build better buildings, more employers, more factories!
- Better quality of products!
- · Change the mindset of consumers!
- Build a more comfortable environment for workers
- Better school systems
- More inspections in the factory

They also wrote down advice for people on how to change the consuming behaviour:

- Change the perspective on how much value objects have!
- Stop buying the products of cheap productions
- Avoid fast fashion!
- Start a petition!
- Buy used clothes!



In the final part of the workshop, the young people were able to choose between the activities of upcycling clothes, sewing a new wearable dress or doing research and designing a city map including sustainable shops in their hometowns. With the help of sewing machines, old-fashioned blouses became fancy tank tops, a far too short skirt became a fitting one and an unwanted t-shirt turned into a fashionable bag. By doing this activity, the youngsters were able to experience how to preserve nice fabrics and to produce something new. Furthermore, it was interesting for them to see that the process of sewing clothes is quite exhausting. The group who designed the city maps including the sustainable stores learned new aspects about their hometowns and found many opportunities to consume in a sustainable way. Every bigger city in all of their countries has second-hand-stores, exchange-stores or world-stores.

Workshop Consumption & Trading

Workshop management: Julia Breu & Michael Jungbauer

The aim of our workshop was to record a small radio show with moderation, music, a survey, expert interviews and the participants' own ideas on the topic of consumption.

After introducing each other, we got into the topic with small games, a talk show and questioned our own consumptive behavior. The second day started with a technical briefing. Then the participants recorded themselves with audio recorders and cut their recordings with the software Audactiy. As part of a prepared treasure hunt called "Actionbound", the participants explored the city centre with tablets and were led to places such as a second-hand shop, the unpacked shop or the community garden of the non-profit organisation "Transition" to answer questions or to solve tasks. This gave the participants an overview of the possibilities for sustainable consumption in Regensburg.

In the afternoon, we put together questions for our survey (for example "What do you do to reduce consumption?" or "Do you prefer shopping in shops, second-hand or online?") and the two upcoming expert interviews. Two groups, equipped with audio recorders and microphones, approached passers-by in the city and conducted the survey independently.

Day 3 of the workshop began with a small quiz in which the youngsters had to answer tricky questions. Afterwards, the participants planned their radio show and together they edited the recordings of their survey and recorded a funny advertisement.

In the afternoon, the interviews with our experts Paul Przybilla (board member of "Transition", a citizens' movement for sustainable change) and Susanne Hauer (Deputy Head of World Heritage Coordination, Cultural Department, World Heritage Management) were conducted and recorded. The group even got small tours of the Transition office and the World Heritage Visitor Centre.

The interviews made clear why sustainable consumption is so important. To quote our moderator: "So, it's time to act now! Let's try to reduce our consumption all together!"

On Friday, we did the final preparations for the recording of our entire radio show: The presenters worked on the texts for their speech, they selected the interlude music and then it was time to put on the headphones and start recording!

Our radio show was then complete and we presented it at the closing ceremony in front of all the guests. It is also on YouTube so that everyone can listen to it worldwide.

Workshop Human Rights

"Get up, stand up, time to act Listen to us cause we talk facts Listen to us cause we want a voice we want a future, but we have no choice!"

This is the phenomenal chorus of the rap group "Future Generation", which was founded at the International Youth Conference 2022. In the Human Rights Workshop, the participants had the opportunity to get to know completely new ways of protesting. Processing the thematic and musical input and writing a text based on this in four short days was a mammoth task. Some of the participants had a hard time imagening performing this text on stage with hip-hop beats.

On the first day of the workshop, the participants discussed human rights in general. To deepen their understanding of the United Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), they were given the task to recognise certain articles in pictures and to assign them accordingly.

As a warm-up on the second day, the participants were questioned about their own opinions on human rights through a positioning game. They positioned themselves on topics such as "Should human rights apply to the unborn?" or "How well does freedom of expression work in your country?". This stimulated a successful discussion. Afterwards, the participants reviewed the human rights implementation at their schools. Before lunch, they were asked to write down the ten articles of the UDHR articles that seemed most important to them personally. In the afternoon, the participants found a common theme to write lyrics for the rap song.

They agreed that the older generations do too little for a secure future and wanted to address this in the song. Main topics for the lyrics were climate justice, having a say, education and paternalism. After defining the topic, the only thing missing was the beat, which they chose together from a compilation. The participants got an introduction to the basics of rap techniques such as rhyme structure, flow on the beat, length of a bar and emphasis of rhyming words. After that, the song writing process began. Each participant was allowed to write their lyrics in their own language.

The third day of the workshop started with a rap/body percussion warm-up. Standing in a circle, they created a rhythm with hands and feet. Each person spoke simple sentences to the rhythm to get a feeling for the flow. Then the lyrics were completed. Lines like "stop, stop our world is burning, they ignore the end people aren't learning", "the flood is coming to drown our hopes" and "when there is no air to breathe, earth is no place to live anymore", show how much the participants feel threatened by future climate problems. The workshop gave them an outlet through which they can give voice to their protest. As a souvenir of the workshop, the track was recorded in the recording studio of W1 - Centre for Young Culture.

On the last day of the workshop, they rehearsed intensively for the performance in the Alte Mälzerei. The well-equipped stage of the W1 served as the perfect place for the rehearsal. Everyone was able to experience the stage feeling while rehearsing the track. After lunch, there was a short breather until the final rehearsal in the Alte Mälzerei. The performance rounded off the workshop and was a great success. For the participants, it was a unique, once in a lifetime experience that they will certainly not forget.

It was a great experience to prepare those dishes by themselves. In addition, it was good to do something practical in which everyone was able to participate.
