What is the International Youth Conference?



The origins

After 2016, 2018 and 2022, the International Youth Conference 2024 was the fourth youth conference in Regensburg. The City of Regensburg organized the first youth conference in the summer of 2016. This conference was a great success. Hence, the city decided to hold an International Youth Conference regularly. With the many experiences of the other three conferences the team managed to keep up the high quality and make the youth conference a great experience for all the participants.

Idea and aim

The idea of We R international is to bring young people from our twin cities together, regardless of the income of their families.

Why are we interested in doing this? Because young people are our future and this future cannot function without thinking outside the box! There is no everyday life without global networks and cooperation. The International Youth Conference wants to create a lasting effect on understanding, exchanges and tolerance across national borders. As we face increasing political instabilities and extremist trends it is important to support young people's commitment and openmindedness all over the world.

Moreover, on an individual level, each single young person should get a chance to make international experiences in order to gain insights in different cultures, practice foreign languages, reflect his or her points of view, get more self-confident, etc. This should not be the privilege of those growing up in well-off homes. That is why the City of Regensburg does not ask for any financial contribution from the participants and their families.

This year's conference concentrated on environmental issues and participation. The motto "Global? Local? Cooperate together!" invited the participants to bring their own ideas to the conference and bring them to life in workshops like "Utopian on Instagram", "Fashion", "Media World" or "Performance", to name some. This year the focus was on a real strong participation of the young people in the workshops. Every idea we see in the presentations was built from almost zero during the conference by the young people, with the workshop managers as support and for giving a framework.

Financing

The 4th International Youth Conference cost about 39.000 €. The "Forum Internationaler Jugendaustausch Regensburg (FIJR)" supported the event financially with 25.000 €.



The participants

The City of Regensburg has invited each twin city to send a delegation of a group of young people aged 16 to 18 with a chaperon to the conference.

The twin cities, which took part, were Budavár (Hungary), Clermont-Ferrand (France), Odesa (Ukraine), Pilsen (Czech Republic) and Tempe (USA). Unfortunately, Aberdeen (Scotland, GB), Brixen (Italy) and Qingdao (China) – weren't able to attend this years' Conference.






Sunday, 28th of July 2024

Welcome Evening

On Sunday, the focus was on the arrival of the groups. After the room distribution, everybody got their conference materials and group photos were taken.

Furthermore, the young people chose the workshops they wanted to attend. They made a priority list from the offered workshops Utopian on Instagram, Fashion, Rap, Performance, Media world, Make it colourful!, Sounds in Light and Darkness and Field Recording. The

lists were analysed overnight and the next day it was announced in which workshop the participants were. Afterwards, the evening started with getting-to-know games. During the dinner in a relaxed atmosphere, everyone got to know each other better and prepared for the day ahead. After dinner, all the participants went to "Grieser Spitz" together where the evening ended with another getting-to-know game and some sports activities like frisbee and spike ball.







Monday, 29th of July 2024 Let the conference begin!

As at past conferences, mayor Mrs. Maltz-Schwarzfischer opened the conference officially. This was followed by presentations of the young people about their hometowns. There were great pictures, funny and creative presentations like a quiz from France, snacks from Pilsen and a song from Odesa.

After a common lunch in the cafeteria, Ulrike de Ponte from the University of Applied Sciences (OTH) Regensburg gave a keynote speech on the topic of emotions in intercultural exchanges. Afterwards a so-called "World Café" was set up. This method created a good atmosphere to exchange views on the various workshop topics. The workshop leaders took the results

of the World Café as connecting element into their workshops.

A World Café is a participatory method in which one question is being discussed at each table. The participants rotate from table to table, with one person remaining at the table and reporting to the next group about the previous discussion. The group continues the discussion.

The evening program took place at the Utopia youth centre in Burgweinting. There was a delicious vegetarian barbecue in a cosy atmosphere with a DJ. Afterwards, the participants were able to do various sports activities.

















Tuesday, 30th of July 2024

Workshop time

The second day of the conference started with a group photo at the multi-generation house. Afterwards the group participated in an intercultural exercise. This exercise dealt among others with widespread prejudices and enabled first discussions about sensitive issues.

Afterwards, the participants explored the city of Regensburg and spent the rest of the morning on guided city tours. As the young people from Regensburg already knew their city, they visited an exhibition called "Ois anders. Großprojekte in Bayern 1945 – 2020" in the Museum of Bavarian History.

Finally, in the afternoon, it was time for the workshops. After getting to know each other, the participants started working on the content right away.

After having dinner at the youth hostel, the participants took part in a funny city rally. Besides answering some questions, the teenagers had to exchange a marble for something else. The group who got the funniest or most creative thing in exchange won a prize.






Wednesday, 31st of July & Thursday, 1st of August 2024 **Workshop time**

In order to bring everyone together, there was an intercultural bowling organized on Wednesday evening. Thursday evening everybody was free to explore the city on his or her own or just relax.








Workshop: Sounds in Light and Darkness -Black Light | Mime | Movement arts

Our aim was to use the participants' themes to create a small, musical stage performance using the elements of black light, mime, role play and movement arts.



The first day was characterised by the participants getting to know each other, experiencing the workshop topics of black light and mime and finding a theme. This was realised through various group games, mime exercises, discussions in the large group and direct experimentation. The common overarching theme of bullying and exclusion soon crystallised. Music from the Phantom of the Opera was incorporated as a central theme.

A short juggling course showed immediate success with some of the participants.



The first two scenes of the planned theatre play were drafted and rehearsed intensively on the second day. In addition, there were further exercises for stage presence and development of the individual characters and many small group games to loosen up and strengthen concentration.

During the course of the day, the participants were able to make masks out of plaster, which were used for the performance.

Unfortunately, one participant was ill from the second day onwards and was unable to take part.



On Thursday, the further scenes and the outcome of the play were designed in intensive group discussions and immediately realised on stage. The very long and dense play demanded a lot of concentration and work from the participants. The course leaders endeavoured to loosen things up with games and breaks. During the afternoon, we worked on the costumes and painted utensils with black light paint.







Friday morning was dedicated entirely to rehearsals and finalising the production. The result was a short theatre piece that evolves from normal light to black light and describes the exclusion and reintegration of someone who is "different".

The participants were able to successfully present the play to an enthusiastic audience in the evening and were very proud of their achievement. The feedback to us as course leaders was very positive, however, all participants found the time very strenuous and felt that the ndividual units were too long.



Workshop: Field Recording

In our Field Recording Workshop, the participants captured sounds related to a social topic of their choice at different locations in Regensburg. They produced a track in the studio using the collected sounds to illustrate the topic acoustically.





The first day the workshop leaders and participants got to know each other. We played several games to help break the ice and foster connection. Afterwards, the participants shared their expectations and wishes for the workshop, allowing the leaders to better understand their goals and aspirations for the week.

After that, the group moved on to brainstorm potential topics. A variety of socially relevant themes were discussed, and an initial list of topics was created to be refined the next day. The day concluded with an introduction to the field recorders, where participants learned how to operate them.

On the second day, participants delved deeper into their preselected topics, using guiding questions such as:

- · What is the problem associated with our topic? Is there a problem?
- Are there possible solutions?
- · If everything was possible, how would you change things?
- How does the government address the issue?
- How does it impact your life?
- · How does it affect all of us?


The group eventually agreed on a final topic: "A Week in the Life of...", aiming to depict the daily routine of a working person over the course of a week. They created the following schedule:



As the week progresses, the concept centered on highlighting the increasing stress and chaos of work, culminating in a peak on Friday, followed by a sudden calm over the weekend, only for Monday to begin again with the same alarm clock sound as the previous days.

With the topic finalized, the group considered which sounds they needed to capture for the project and where they could go to record them. They devised a plan and immediately set out to collect the necessary recordings. This process took the remaining day and extended into the following morning.

Once all the sounds were recorded, the participants began sorting through the recordings. Divided into groups, they worked at different computers to be more effective. Afterwards, they assembled the project using an audio software. The tracks were enhanced with effects, sped up, reversed, and gradually the soundscape of each day in the protagonist's week began to take shape.



The final day was spent making minor adjustments. After a feedback session, the project was exported, and the workshop concluded with a presentation of the finished piece.



Workshop: Make it colorful!

The goal of the workshop is to present a common topic with as many self-made colors as possible.

Since the workshop only prescribes a method but no topic, finding a topic was the first task to be done in the group. Therefore, a few games were played to break the ice and get some conversation started. Quickly a common Topic became clear: pollution.

Everyone drew what came to mind on the subject. In those drawing you could see some sub points of pollution, like water, air and light pollution.

On the second day, a more intensive research was scheduled on the question: what is my country/my city doing against water pollution? The participants received a sheet from the workshop manager on how to research and what tools are available. The aim was to find out some law and regulations of the country one is coming from and present it to the rest of the

group. Afterwards there was time to talk about it and make up each owns mind.

In the afternoon we made a trip to two parks where the participants had the task: Get your white paper as colorful as possible. In the method of try and error leaves were pressed, dirt was rubbed, berries were squeezed...

The day ended with a list of colors the group wants to produce and a list of ingredients that needs to be gathered.

On Thursday, it took a long time to produce all colors alternately. Each had a different recipe. The participants helped and supported each other and tried out the colors.









At the end of the day, they made a sketch of their final painting and started to color them with the homemade paint.

On the last day, the picture was finished in joint and independent work.

After a short rehearsal, the closing event began. The participants reported on their workshop, told about their topic and explained their painted in detail. Meanwhile, samples of the self-made paint were passed through the audience, which could be seen, smelled and felt.



Workshop: Media World -Al's impact on News and Social Media

"Whoever controls the media, controls the mind." -Jim Morisson. Nowadays we consume media in various forms, whether it be videos on platforms like YouTube, Instagram, or TikTok, newspaper articles or magazines, memes, podcasts, forums, or images on the internet. The media influences our opinion on topics and changes our thinking. The evolution of the different media types is fast and we all have the challenge to catch up with this changing. One big improvement is

the development of Artificial Intelligence (AI), which makes new ways of creating media possible. The workshop Media Worlds dealt with this evolution of media and the participants learned how to use AI properly and created their own media products using Al.

We started with some games, so the participants got to know each other. Through this, they started to talk about their own experiences with media. We talked









about social media, fake news, how news are influenced by politics, in which way they consume media and news and if they used AI before and how they used it. This process led us to our main topic: Al's impact on news and social media. After this, we defined the framework of our project. At first, we thought about different types of media we could produce with AI. After we discussed some possible media products, the group decided to make five of them: A fake video interview, deep fake photos, music generated by AI, an AI podcast and a step-by-step guide which contains information about, how you can use AI to educate yourself. Also we discussed the reason for doing all those "fake stuff": to show the amazing potential of Al, but also the problems and dangers of these programs.

On Wednesday we started with some warm up games and after this, we structured our results from the day before and discussed possible ways for the production of our media products. After we split the group and everybody chose one media product and took the responsibility for the creation of this product. The first step was a researching phase on the different topics/ media product, where the participants gathered information and different AI programs, which we could use. The second phase was the production of the media products, which we also started on Wednesday.

On Thursday the participants continued their work on the media products. They took photos for the deep fakes, they filmed the interviews, they used different Al programs to write a song text and a melody for the Al song and used Al to generate the podcast. Their research and the already finished step-by-step guide helped them. We also started with the third phase and talked about our presentation. We wanted to use a web-blog to present our results. Every media product the workshop group created was uploaded to a website, which also contained information about the thinking processes behind every media product.

The presentation day came very fast and we finished our media products and the website last second on Friday. After a short lunch break, we met again, finished the blog and talked about the presentation. In the afternoon the rehearsal took place at the "Degginger" and we checked if everything is working properly, which did. The presentation in the evening was great and the "Media Group" was very proud after they presented their results.



Workshop: Performance

The goal of this workshop was to explore a topic (which the participants choose regarding what moves them the most) and turn that into a performance which incorporates the mediums music, acting and movements. How all that came to be was dependent of the participants and their wishes/progress.

Tuesday:

On the first day the group got to know each other and worked out, how they want to work together for this workshop as well as with what medium (movement, acting, music). The group decided on all three mediums and found a theme quite fast. The topic they wanted to explore was fears and how to deal with them. In the next step the group brainstormed ideas regarding the topic and they were introduced to exploring the space with different movements and impulses from the workshop leaders.





Wednesday:

The next day started with a warm up game (Ninja). After that each member of the group worked on their individual fears and how they deal with them and shared that with the group which led to a deeper conversation about their fears and fears in general. The next step was to start exploring body movements with a game of Ha- He- Ho which incorporated different important elements of a performance. In the next part of the workshop the group was introduced





to acting with a theatrical mask and they got to deeply explore the joy of curiosity. Then the group got the task of preparing the performance in 10 Minutes and show the result to the workshop leaders. This was a challenge for the group but created the foundation for the next day.



Thursday:

The main task of this day was the creating and specifying of the performance. The group decided to work mainly independent at first. After they showed their result, the workshop leaders worked on the details and improving of the performance and of course rehearsing all the aspects of the performance.





Friday:

For the last day, the group rehearsed the performance for the last time. After that, they reflected the workshop and talked about the different aspects and their feeling regarding everything. As last step before the big presentation the group got to the final rehearsal where they also worked out lightning and sound on the stage.

Each member of the group took a close look at their fear and how they can and want to deal with them and turned it into a captivating performance.



Workshop: Rap

What impact do social media platforms have on our social behavior? This was the question posed by the three participants of the rap workshop at the Youth Conference 2024. Since the workshop didn't have a specific topic in advance, the participants were able to start a creative process with the goal of producing a rap song.

During the first two days, the young people focused on developing a common theme. They engaged in deep discussions about interpersonal interactions and how a world without smartphones and social media might look. From these reflections, the idea for the song emerged.







In the afternoon of the second day, they first created a mind map, and after a brief input on songwriting, they eagerly began writing their lyrics.

The third day was dedicated to finalizing the lyrics, and in the afternoon, they started recording in the W1 studio. Recording in front of a microphone was unfamiliar for the participants, but it was also an exciting experience. With the help of coaching, they all successfully completed the task and had a lot of fun in the process.

The fourth and final day was spent preparing for the evening performance. At the closing event at the Degginger, the participants performed their track live.

True to the lyrics "Put your phone down, go outside", they stepped out of their comfort zones and embraced a new experience.



Workshop: Screenprinting – Fashion

The aim of the workshop is to work together with the participants to explore a chosen topic using the methods of 'screen printing', 'tie dyeing' and 'fashion'. Besides that, another goal of the project is to raise awareness among the teenagers about cultural differences and to promote friendly and respectful interactions with each other (i.e., intercultural and social competence). In addition, there is the option for the teenagers to develop a sense of community through collaborative group work.


Tuesday:

We started the workshop by getting to know each other. We did a warm-up and introduced ourselves as workshop leaders. Afterwards the group introduced themselves to everyone.

After we got to know each other a bit better we started to introduce the purpose of the workshop. We started by explaining the main techniques and methods of screen-printing. The participants had many creative ideas which they wanted to add during the process: such as tie dyeing, sewing or making jewellery. Right after we started to work in smaller groups to collect all ideas and creating a common topic the participants wanted to work with. The outcome was: "What is love?" At the end of the day, we started to make a plan for the upcoming workshop days.

We ended every workshop day with a short reflection about the day.





Wednesday:

On Wednesday morning, we got back together and started with a little warm-up to wake up. Afterwards we divided the participants in small groups. The aim was to discuss possible designs and sketches and gather some material. After the lunchbreak, we were ready to start the more practical part of the workshop. The members started to do stencils and templates for the screenprinting, creating an individual design for everyone and planning a whole concept without leaving the final presentation out of sight.





Thursday:

On Thursday the group continued with the tasks we planned the days before. Some of the members started dyeing the fabrics and t-shirts as some of them already started creating some fitting jewelry. Some others started making stencils for the screen-printing so we could start the screen printing process in the afternoon. The whole group stayed on their tasks the whole afternoon.







Friday:

On Friday morning the workshop participants finished up the pieces. Afterwards they developed a concept for the final presentation in the evening. As the group decided that they wanted to do a fashion show, some of the participants immediately started making a power point presentation that could be shown in the background for more information during the show. As the youngsters finished their project, we could do our last reflection of the workshop and go to the final rehearsal.

All in all the members of the workshop had many creative ideas as well as many constructive discussions about the topic "What is love?".






Workshop: Utopian on Instagram

During the JUKO, the workshop group posted on the Instagram channel of the international youth work of the city of Regensburg "regensburg_international". The workshop created posts, stories and reels everything under the banner of utopia. On the first day, the teenagers and young adults were able to get to know each other. The group of six girls was a completely international mix. Afterwards the group got a little introduction about the theme utopia. There are many items that can be pictured in an utopian way. The utopian theme helps to think outside the box and to draw attention to issues or needs.

The participants brainstormed together and decided to focus on the topics of lifestyle, nature and equality. It also quickly became clear that they wanted to involve the residents of Regensburg and the other participants via surveys on instagram. 

Friday, 2nd of August 2024 Last day and Closing Party


On Friday morning, the last workshop units took place and the presentations for the final event were finetuned. In the afternoon, it was time for the rehearsal.
